that is what their ancestors did to the prophets.

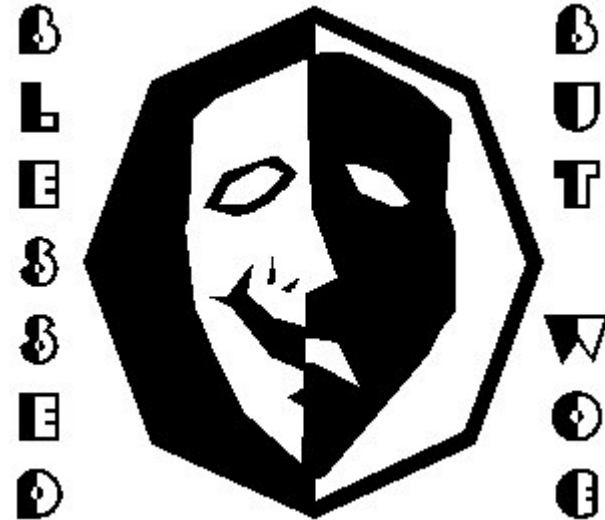
'But woe to you who are rich,
for you have received your consolation.

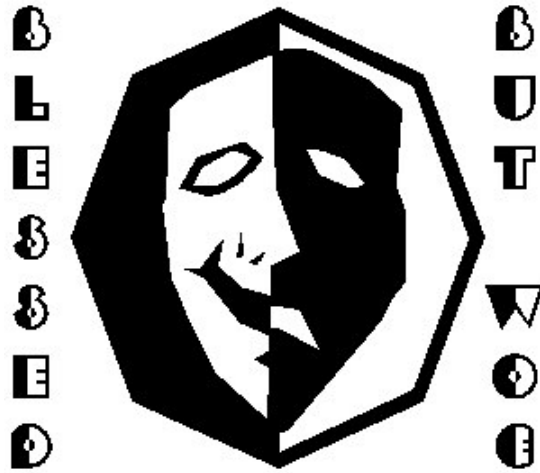
'Woe to you who are full now,

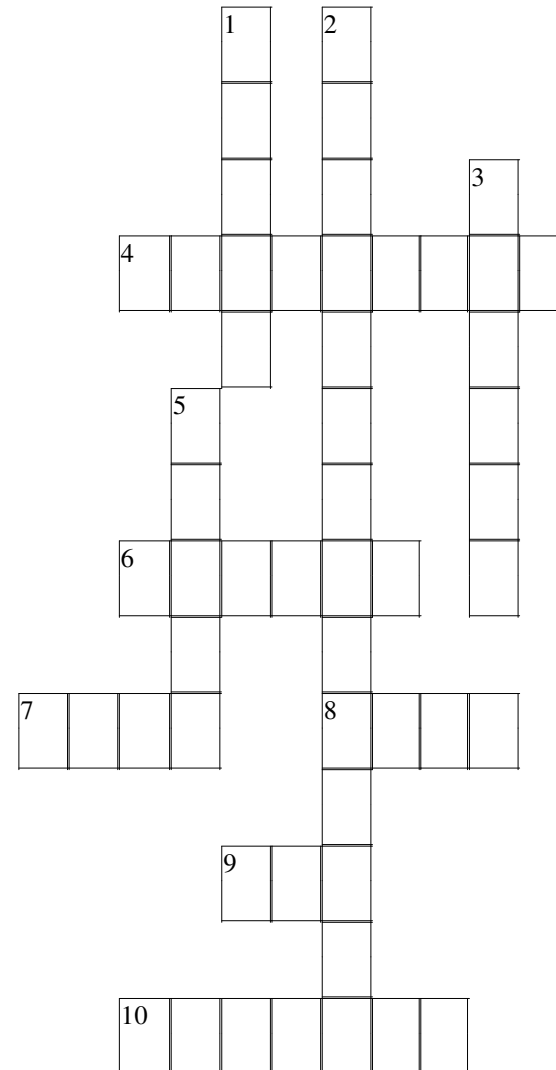
